	A 2004 study revealed that nurses generally worked longer than scheduled and that approxim 40 percent of the work shifts they logged exceeded 12 hours. The risk of making an error significantly increased when work shifts were longer than 12 hours, when nurses worked over or when they worked more than 40 hours per week.
