## RE: Vermonters' Attitudes Toward Collective Bargaining For Early Childhood Educators

On behalf of the AFT and United Professions Vermont, Hart Research Associates conducted a telephone survey among 604 registerered voters in Vermont from December 16 to 18, 2011. The overall margin of error for this survey is  $\pm 4.1$  percentage points and is larger among subgroups. The full text of key questions follows below.

I am going to mention a few goals that some people have for issues that the state government might address. For each goal I mention, please tell me whether it is very important, fairly important, just somewhat important, or not important to you personally.
