
It has come to the attention of Vermont's early educators that legislators are considering the elimination of the Starting Points' grants. As local Starting Points Network leaders, we ask you to protect this successful initiative that fosters leadership, professional development, and support for early educators - all of which make us better teachers for children in the crucial years before they enter kindergarten.

Early education is a field with high rates of turnover and burnout. Contributing factors include low pay, minimal benefits, isolation, few opportunities for career advancement, and a lack of respect for early educators as professionals. The Starting Points initiative was begun in 1996 to encourage the formation of Network groups to help counteract some of these factors. By coming together as colleagues, early educators have grown to be strong leaders, advocates, mentors, and professionals.

Currently each region is awarded its own grant money; decisions are made locally about how to make best use of the funding. Individual Starting Points Networks may provide different activities, but all have the same goal: to ensure the quality of early care and education in Vermont.

Over the last four months, early educators have joined together on an unprecedented scale. Changes and budget cuts at the state level are affecting our profession in many ways, all of which impact our ability to deliver quality care to the children and families who count on us so they can go to work each day. The Starting Points' Networks will be even more important as we navigate an early education system that is underfunded and can offer fewer resources.

Although in previous years the Starting Points' grants sustained budget cuts, early educators made sacrifices to keep our Network groups running. If we eliminate this vital program, children and families, as well as early educators, will be harmed.



We urge you to protect the Starting Points' funding.


